Adult Registration Packet

You are invited to attend the 2025 Youth Get-Away event held at The Glorieta Adventure Camp in Santa Fe, April 11-13, 2025. The registration fee covers: Room, Program Expenses, T-Shirt, and Five Meals.

The State 4-H Leadership Team will be the hosts of Youth Get-Away. Their goal is to help youth succeed in personal and professional growth. There are exciting activities and workshops scheduled to provide youth with opportunities to learn leadership skills, team building, career resources, and community service. During YGA registered adults can attend these activities and workshops to take pictures and check on their participants.

The event's theme is: **"Be out of this world with 4-H"**

Cost:

\$180.00 per person for 4-H'ers and adults (conference attendance, t-shirt, meals, lodging)

Registration:

Check with your County Extension office for the registration information needed. You must register with your county agent by the county deadline in order to attend. Late registrations are not accepted.

Chaperones:

The ratio of youth to adults is 8 to 1. For every **8 male youth there needs to be 1 male chaperone** and for every **8 female youth there needs to be 1 female adult**.

Lodging:

All participants will stay on-site in dorm-style accommodations. Youth and adults will room separately. Each room has an ensuite bathroom. Adults will stay in the same building as the youth delegation they are chaperoning. Male and Female participants will be housed in different building/floors. Rooms are inspected by chaperones at check in time and again by chaperones and camp staff on the day of departure.

Insurance:

American Income Life Insurance Company covers all participants for accidents and illnesses from the time they leave home until their return. Please report any accidents or illnesses to the State 4-H Staff.

Counselors and CIT's:

- Seniors have the opportunity to apply to serve as counselors or CIT's for this event.
- Counselors in Training (CIT)- Senior members 13 and in the 8th grade or 14 year olds
- Counselor- Senior youth 15 year olds
- Counselors/CITs will need to arrive the afternoon of Thursday, April 10th, to Glorieta Adventure Camp, to begin training.
- 4-H members are NOT permitted to drive to Youth Get-Away.
- The counselor/CIT application is available online with the registration information. **Applications must be submitted to the State 4-H Office by March 3rd.** Youth chosen to serve as counselors and CITs are informed by email and by mail if they are selected. Additional information is sent after selection.
- This year there will be 15 counselors and 15 CITs selected.
- Counselors and CITs are registered through the state office and not through their county office.

Forms:

Adult registering as attendants must submit the NM 4-H Medical/Liability Release Form. One must be turned into your County Extension Office by the county registration deadline.

Policies:

- ★ Youth Get-Away is a unique leadership experience where each delegate demonstrates the personal character for which 4-H is known.
- ★ Participate in all Senior Leadership Retreat activities and stay with the group. The program calls for your complete involvement. Do not invite friends to visit you.
- ★ Participants are responsible for paying any damage to the facility.
- ★ **No alcoholic beverages, drugs, stimulants, vape items of any kind or tobacco in any form to be used by participants.**

Cancellations and Refunds:

- ★ Cancellations and refunds are made only if road conditions in the Santa Fe vicinity are severe. Drivers must make their own travel decisions based on road conditions in their area.
We do not want anybody taking unnecessary risks in order to attend this event.
- ★ **Refunds cannot be made unless there is a National Weather Service storm warning in existence in the Santa Fe area.**
- ★ If a refund is made due to bad weather, there will be a surcharge deducted to cover actual program expenses incurred up to that point.
- ★ **After registration is closed, if a 4-H'er or adult who is registered cannot attend, a county can substitute another person of the same sex in his or her place, but an actual refund will not be made. If there is no one from your county to fill the spot, please let the state office know and we will try to find a replacement.**
- ★ **A full refund to a participant is only made if the cancellation is due to an emergency, health issue or made before the county registration deadline.**

Phone Messages:

ITEMS NEEDED FOR THE WEEKEND

Although Youth Get-Away is held during the spring, the mornings and evenings will be cold, so please come prepared. You should include:

Necessary Items:

Money: for travel, snacks, purchases.

School/Outdoor clothing in good taste will be appropriate. **No offensive slogans, short skirts, muscle shirts or spaghetti straps please! If dressed inappropriately, you will be asked to change your clothing. Please review the dress code with your county if you have any questions.**

- Your bedding, pillows, towels (2 minimum), washcloth, blankets and any other linens with you
- Toiletries – Toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, soap, cream, mirror, comb, brush
- Tote or Toiletries Bag – To take your items to and from the shower.
- T-Shirts – Bring several that you don't mind getting dirty.
- Jacket / Long Sleeves – Bring clothes you can layer.
- Jeans/Long Pants – Bring several pairs to stay warm.
- Shoes – comfortable walking shoes and shower shoes are encouraged
- Socks & Underwear – Bring extra of both, it's an Adventure Camp!
- Rainwear – A rain jacket or poncho will be the most important of these items.
- Hat/Bandana – We recommend bringing a warmer hat for when temperatures drop.
- Gloves – It can get chilly. You may want a pair of light, water-resistant gloves for when it does.
- Winter Coat – If you are attending in the cooler months, bring a well-insulated, weather-resistant coat.
- Pajamas

OTHER ITEMS (recommended)

- Water bottles
- Flashlight/Headlamp with extra batteries
- Sunscreen
- Pen/pencil, notebook, book
